SCORING A NETBALL MATCH

WHY SHOULD I LEARN TO SCORE?

There are many reasons why you might want/need to score a netball match...

1. You play in a league, and you have to take it in turns to score
2. You have a training match and your coach wants someone to score
3. You want to get involved in netball, but you don't want to play
4. Your child plays netball and you are helping out at a match

The list is endless, and so through this downloadable pack we hope to inspire more people to get involved in other netball roles!

HOW DO I SCORE?

1. Write the team names in the top boxes, the team who is the 'home team' would go in the left hand side box, and the 'away team' goes in the right hand box. This is the same order they are written on the schedule.

2. The scorecard is split into four rows, one for each quarter and two columns, one for each team. This is where you will record each quarters score, for each team. Team A's score will be in all the left hand boxes and Team B's in all the right hand boxes, starting from the top.

3. The score is recorded in numbers. So when the team scores their first goal, you would write 1, then if they score another goal you would cross this out and put a 2.

4. At the start of the quarter, you would then carry down the final numbers from the previous quarter, and continue to add up from here. You repeat this each quarter. Then you will know how many goals were scored in each quarter.

5. On the next page, we will teach you about what information goes in the small boxes, within each quarters box (labelled red for this example).

HOW DO I KNOW WHO TAKES THE NEXT CENTRE PASS?

6. Now you know how to score a game, this is one more thing you need to know!

In netball, teams take it in turn to take a centre pass. The team that takes the first pass is decided by a coin toss before the match.

A system called 'Odds and Evens' is used to keep track of which team has the centre pass during a netball match, so that there are a fair number of turns for each team.

This is recorded in the small boxes, which can be found just inside each teams quarter box.

The team that has the first pass will be 'EVENS' and so should have E written in their first small box, whilst the other team would be 'ODDS' and have an 'O'.

The 'Even' team would then take the centre pass every time the score added to an even number ie: if the score was 4-4, as this adds to 8, and the 'Odd' team would take the centre pass every time the score added to an odd number ie: 3-2 as this adds to 5.

Each quarter this would then switch, so with the example above 'Team A' would become 'Evens' and 'Team B' would become 'Odds'. You would write this in the small boxes for quarter 2.

The only time you would not switch the 'Odds' and 'Evens' would be if the whistle for the break went straight after a goal BEFORE a centre pass had been taken. In this instance, the 'Odds' and 'Evens' would NOT be changed and simply carried down to the next box.








**OBSTRUCTION OF
