World Netball has today announced the International Technical Officials (ITO) selected for the Trinbago 2023 Commonwealth Youth Games (CYG).

12 ITO have been selected, including three (3) members of the Umpire Appointment Panel (UAP) and nine (9) Match Officials (Umpires), to officiate the FAST5 netball competition taking place from the 8th – 10th August 2023. This is the first-time netball will feature in the CYG, with <u>eight countries selected to send a team to compete at Shaw Park, Tobago</u>.
