## **World Netball & NETFIT NZ Launch Social Media Campaign on the Rules of Netball 2024 Edition**

World Netball (WN), in collaboration with NETFIT NZ, have this week launched a social media campaign to promote the Rules of Netball 2024 Edition, with the new rules now being followed in all international matches, as of the 1<sup>st</sup> January 2024.

This comes after WN launched the Rules of Netball 2024 Edition in December 2023, alongside educational videos, and PDFs, with the aim to encourage all the Netball Family, not just the umpires, to use the new simplified rules book.

The Rules of Netball App has also now been updated, and this can be downloaded now from the [Apple](#) and [Google Play](#) stores.

WN and NETFIT NZ will be sharing infographics and videos across social media throughout January, explaining all the rule modifications including allowing teams to make tactical changes immediately after a goal is scored, changes to the short pass rule and the removal of the toss up.
