

Sue Taylor AM has provided exceptional service and dedication to Netball in many far-reaching roles representing her country Australia internationally, domestically and in her home state of Western Australia.

A professional and highly efficient administrator Sue was President of the Netball Australia Board from 1995 to 2005.

Sue was a Board Member of the Australian Commonwealth Games Association from 1994–2011, including a significant term as Vice President. During that time, she was also a member of the Commonwealth Games Federation Board, one of the first women to fill that role. She is currently a member of the CGF Ethics Commission.

Sue’s legal expertise was called upon at so many World Netball events as member or chair of the Jury of Appeal and at this World Cup she will chair the Event Judicial Panel.

Sue’s passion to give back to netball led her to establish and

lead World Netball Foundation Working Group – so it is wonderful for her to be here in Cape Town to see us launching the World Netball Foundation.

Sue has been instrumental to the development of the many levels of sports and has helped make World Netball what it is today.
